



Worship Service Theme: Third Sunday of Advent: JOY

Welcome: Welcome! My name is ____ and I'll be leading our worship time today. Today is the third Sunday of Advent. The word "advent" comes from the Latin word "adventus," which means "arrival" or "coming." Advent is the season before Christmas when the church remembers and celebrates the coming of Christ to Earth and looks forward to Jesus' return in glory.

(Turn on the candles of Hope, Peace, and Joy – or have someone in the front row "light" them.)

The first two Sundays of Advent, we lit the **PURPLE** candles of hope and peace. Purple is the traditional color for Advent, but today, the third week of Advent, we light the **PINK** candle of joy. In church tradition, pink represents joy. Pink is also associated with Mary, the mother of Jesus, whose joy in the Lord is our focus today.

With these candles, we remember how the birth of Jesus brought hope, peace, and joy into the world. Please pray with me as we open our time together.

Opening prayer: God of hope, who brought love into this world,
be the love that dwells among us.
God of hope, who brought peace into this world,
be the peace that dwells among us.

God of hope, who brought joy into this world,
be the joy that dwells among us.
God of hope, the rock we stand upon,
be the center, the focus of our lives
always, and particularly this Advent time. Amen.¹

Second reading: Luke 1:39-49. This story happens soon after the angel Gabriel appears to Mary and tells her that she will be the mother of the Christ child.

³⁹ At that time Mary got ready and hurried to a town in the hill country of Judea,⁴⁰ where she entered Zechariah's home and greeted her cousin Elizabeth.

⁴¹ When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in Elizabeth's womb,

and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. ⁴² In a loud voice Elizabeth exclaimed: “Blessed are you, Mary, among women, and blessed is the child you will bear! ⁴³ But why am I so favored, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? ⁴⁴ As soon as the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy. ⁴⁵ Blessed is she who has believed that the Lord would fulfill his promises to her!”

⁴⁶ And Mary said:

“My soul glorifies the Lord
⁴⁷ and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior,
⁴⁸ for he has been mindful of the humble state of his servant.
From now on all generations will call me blessed,

Interactive Homily: Let’s talk more about joy.

- What are some things, events, and people that make you feel joyful?
 - *[generate lots of ideas! Children, grandchildren, spouses, friends, pets, places where you grew up or visited, birthdays, weddings ...]*
- Mary, the mother of Jesus, is obviously a big part of the Christmas story. Earlier I read part of Mary’s joyous song after she meets with her cousin, Elizabeth. Let’s think more about Mary at this time in her life. Did Mary have reason to be joyful? Hmm ... what were Mary’s circumstances at the time? Mary was:
 - Unmarried
 - Young
 - Poor
 - And pregnant!
- How would you (or really anyone) probably feel in these circumstances?
 - A lot of uncertainty and fear; “what is going to happen to me??”
- But Mary bursts into a song of joy! I wonder why you think Mary had joy in this moment?
 - First, she is not alone. After the angel’s visit Mary immediately goes to visit her cousin, Elizabeth, and Elizabeth speaks the Holy Spirit’s

encouragement to Mary: “Blessed is she who has believed that the Lord would fulfill his promises to her!” Elizabeth reassures Mary that God is *trustworthy* and is *with her*, past, present, and future.

- What else does Mary do? What are the first words of Mary’s song?
 - Mary sings, “My soul glorifies **the Lord**, and my spirit rejoices **in God** my savior.” Other translations say, “My soul *magnifies* the Lord.” What happens when you magnify something?
 - It gets bigger – and everything outside the magnification gets smaller.
 - Mary makes God the biggest focus of her heart and mind.
- Mary then sings, “God has been *mindful* of the humble state of his servant. *From now on* all generations will call me blessed.” According to Mary, where is God in Mary’s situation, and what is God doing?
 - God is thinking about and guiding Mary all the time!
 - God has not left Mary to buck up and fend for herself. Mary trusts that God is doing great things for her. “God has been mindful of *me*! All generations will call me *blessed* [that is, joyful/happy]!”
- What a great image and model for us! How do you think we can be like Mary and live joyfully despite challenging circumstances?
 - Seek out support: Like Mary did with Elizabeth, get help and encouragement from wise and godly people.
 - Focus: Like Mary, focus your mind and heart on the Lord – not your circumstances.
 - Enlarge: Like Mary, magnify and glorify the Lord. Make God bigger in your heart and mind! God’s presence of love and peace can and will diminish despair, fear, and worry.
 - Believe: Like Mary, believe God’s promises of blessings to come. Be confident that God has great plans for you. You are never forgotten or alone.

... Let’s take a moment to silently pray and reflect on the joy of the Lord.

(Silent Prayer) ... Lord, in your love and mercy, hear our prayers. Now let us pray the Lord’s prayer together:

Lord’s Prayer: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory forever, Amen.
