

Worship Service Theme: Fourth Sunday of Advent: LOVE

Helpful Elements:

Welcome: Welcome! My name is ____ and I'll be leading our worship time today. Today is the fourth and final Sunday of Advent. The word "advent" comes from the Latin word "adventus," which means "arrival" or "coming." Advent is the season before Christmas when the church remembers and celebrates the coming of Christ to Earth and looks forward to Jesus' return in glory.

(Turn on the candles of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love – or have someone in the front row "light" them.) In our first weeks of Advent, we lit the PURPLE candle of hope; then the PURPLE candle of peace; then the PINK candle of joy. Today, we light the final PURPLE candle of love, remembering how the birth of Jesus brought hope, peace, joy, and love into the world.

Please pray with me as we open our time together.

Opening prayer: God of hope, who brought love into this world, be the love that dwells among us.

God of hope, who brought peace into this world, be the peace that dwells among us.

God of hope, who brought joy into this world, be the joy that dwells among us.

God of hope, the rock we stand upon,

be the center, the focus of our lives always, and particularly this Advent time. Amen.¹

⁷ Dear friends, let us continue to love one another, for love comes from God. Anyone who loves is a child of God and knows God. ⁸ But anyone who does not love does not know God, for God is love.

⁹ God showed how much he loved us by sending his one and only Son into the world so that we might have eternal life through him. ¹⁰ This is real love—not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as a sacrifice to take away our sins.

¹¹ Dear friends, since God loved us that much, we surely ought to love each other. ¹² No one has ever seen God. But if we love each other, God lives in us, and his love is brought to full expression in us.

Interactive Homily: Let's talk more about love.

- We typically say we "love" a particular thing. What kinds of things do you love? (generate lots of ideas in all categories)
 - o People, pets, food, painting, piece of music, even self.
 - We love these things in different ways, right? We don't say that we love a person the same way we love pizza © So there are many kinds of love.
- Let's think a bit beyond "feelings" of love. What would you think if someone said they *felt love* for you ... but never *showed* you that they loved you?
 - Empty words! Not reassuring or genuine. Talk is cheap.
- So how do we complete love or prove that love is real and genuine?
 - We *show* love through *actions*.
- As an example, let's think about the Christmas season. How do some people show that they *really love* Christmas? For example, what do a lot of people who "love Christmas" do with their houses during the holidays, inside and out?
 - o Decorations! What kind?
 - Lights, nativity scene on the front lawn, Christmas tree(s), nutcrackers, stockings, wreaths ...

- What's another way that we traditionally show love at Christmastime, often on Christmas morning?
 - We give gifts as symbols of love for another.
- I wonder why we might say that Christmas itself a gift. What happened at the first Christmas?
 - Jesus was born! "They shall call him Immanuel, God With Us."
 - The great reminder at Christmas is that God doesn't just feel love toward us. "God showed how much he loved us by sending his one and only Son into the world so that we might have eternal life through him. This is real love..." (1 John 4:9-10, NLT)
- So how would you describe God's love what is God's love like?
 - o First clue: Who did God send Jesus to?
 - EVERYONE. God's love is universal. Jesus came to the world not just a special subsection of humanity. God loves every single person, unconditionally.
 - Second clue: When does God love us?
 - ALWAYS. God's love is eternal. God sent Jesus to draw us to God forever: "so that we might have eternal life." This was and is the purpose of Christmas, the greatest gift ever given.
- As the apostle John wrote, "If we love each other, God lives in us, and his love is brought to *full expression* in us" (1 John 4:12). As people of faith, how can we "decorate ourselves" to show God's love to other people? What loving actions can we do during this season especially?
 - o *Tell* someone how you feel about them! Go beyond simply "I love you" and tell people *what qualities* you love about them.
 - o Share a favorite memory or story with someone.
 - Write a card or call on the phone.
 - Do something helpful for someone else: offer to wash or dry dishes, fold laundry, get them a glass of water or a cup of tea ... [generate ideas]
 - Thank God for his love!

... Let's take a moment to silently pray and reflect on God's love and how to spread God's love to the world.

(Silent Prayer) ... Lord, in your love and mercy, hear our prayers. Now let us pray the Lord's prayer together:

Lord's Prayer: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily

bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory forever, Amen.
